


A process to help manage the "busyness" of our Church without turning the Church into a "business."





Strategic Planning is Biblical









Proven Orthodox Strategic Planning Process


Our process has be used to complete strategic plans covering over 20% of Orthodox Christians in America







The Elements of Strategic Planning





What is Strategic Planning



A Strategic Plan must answer 4 fundamental questions:

- 1. Why do we exist?
- 2. Where are we now?
- 3. Where do we want to be?
- 4. How will we get there?





The 4 P's of Strategic Planning





The Essential 4 P's of Church Strategic Planning



- 1. <u>Process</u> A comprehensive, inclusive and methodical process and schedule
- 2. <u>People</u> The right people leading, developing and implementing the plan, with input from everyone along the way
- 3. <u>Product</u> A comprehensive strategic plan with a detailed implementation plan and timeline
- 4. <u>Performance</u> The plan implementation must be well-managed (more non-profit strategic plans fail in this step than for any other reason)

Stewardship Calling Six Step Work Plan



Step One Opening Retreat to determine SWOT, Statement of Why, Mission, Vision, Core Values, Strategic Areas of Focus

Step Two <u>Task Force Meetings</u> to draft Strategic Goals and Action Plans

Step Three <u>Public Presentations</u> of draft Strategic Goals and Action Plans for feedback and consensusbuilding (Task Forces synthesize comments)

Step Four Closing Retreat to finalize SMART Strategic Goals and Action Plans

Step Five Finalize Strategic Plan + Clergy Laity Assembly Roll Out

Step Six <u>Implementation</u> with continual communication


